



What the Jr. High Course Book says:

Chorus 8 - (known as 8th Grade Girls Choir at SVJH): 1 year course - This course is a study of intermediate music fundamentals: sight-reading skills with emphasis on solfége, intonation, appropriate performance techniques, and good sound production. The intent of this course is to encourage students to achieve competency in three-to-four-part choral singing. The chorus also serves as a school representative at various community, district and statewide events

Boys Chorus - (known as Men's Chorale at SVJH): 1 year course - This course is a study of beginning and intermediate music fundamentals: sight-reading skills with emphasis on solfége, good intonation, sound production, and performance skills. The intent of this course is to achieve competency in areas of unison to three-part singing. Special attention is given to understanding and development of the boys' changing voices. The chorus also serves as a school representative at various community, district and statewide events.

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Beginning Dance

This course will include an introduction to various dance styles. Emphasis will be placed on awareness of technique/skill, history, knowledge, improvisation, and aesthetics of each dance style.

- Students will participate and relate dance as a lifetime fitness and health-related activity.
- Students will be offered the opportunity to perform in a dance concert.





Students may only take <u>ONE</u> PE course in 8th Grade



Intro to Weight Training

This course will introduce resistance training and include a variety of exercises, techniques and programs.

- Students will learn and apply health-related concepts, proper nutrition and physiology.
- Students will learn and demonstrate correct techniques of core lifts, which may include squat and power clean.
- Cardiovascular conditioning and individual fitness assessments will be included.









Students may only take <u>ONE</u> PE course in 8th Grade

Team Sports

This course will provide an opportunity for students who have a high level of interest and skill in team sports to participate in offerings such as softball, volleyball, soccer, flag football, basketball and other sports.

The health-related physical fitness test is administered twice each semester.


