The chorus also serves as a school representative at various community, district and statewide events
Boys Chorus - (known as Men's Chorale at SVJH): 1 year course - This course is a study of beginning and intermediate music fundamentals: sight-reading skills with emphasis on solfége, good intonation, sound production, and performance skills. The intent of this course is to achieve competency in areas of unison to three-part singing. Special attention is given to understanding and
development of the boys' changing voices. The chorus also serves as a school representative at various community, district and statewide events.
